#### Project:

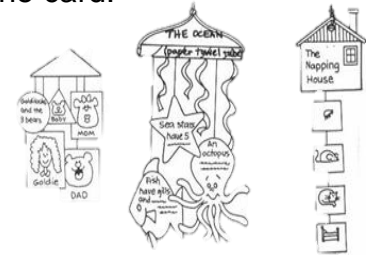
You will have ten cards hanging from your mobile and one at the top (eleven total).

Their shape and size is your decision. **Each card needs to have the information as well as a picture.** The picture should relate to the information on the card.

**Each card should be clearly labeled and easy to identify.**

**The ten cards are:**

1. **Title** and **Author** of the book you read.  
(this one goes at the top)
2. **Main Characters** (at least three with a short description of **each** character) 1 card for each character
3. **Setting** (time and place) that the story takes place.
4. **Conflict** (what was the problem that happened in the story).
5. **Solution** (how did the characters solve the problem).
6. **Favorite Part** of the story written in **at least** 3 sentences.
7. **Summarize** the story in at least **five** sentences and no more than **ten**.  
You should have at least 5 details that happen in the story.  
Make sure you only choose the MOST important details to include.
8. **Personal Opinion** of the book and why you liked or did not like it.



Make sure that your whole project is of good quality and that it shows how much time you took to work on it. Make a project you are proud of and want to keep in your room or show off to others!

You will present your book report in class during the first week of school. Practice reading your cards so that you can read all the words.

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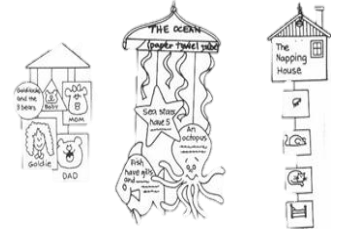

## Proyecto:

Tendrás nueve cartas colgadas de tu móvil y una en la parte superior (once en total). Su forma y tamaño es su decisión. **Cada tarjeta necesita tener la información y un imagen.** La imagen debe referirse a la información de la tarjeta

**Cada tarjeta debe estar claramente etiquetada y fácil de identificar.**  
**Las once tarjetas son:**



1. **Título y autor** del libro que lee. (Éste va en la tapa)
2. **Personajes principales** (al menos tres con una breve descripción de cada carácter)  
**1 tarjeta para cada personaje**
3. **Establecimiento** (tiempo y lugar) que tiene lugar el cuento.
4. **Conflicto** (cuál fue el problema que sucedió en el cuento).
5. **Solución** (cómo los personajes resolvieron el problema).
6. **Parte favorita del cuenta**, escrita en al menos 3 oraciones.
7. **Resuma el cuento** en al menos cinco oraciones y no más de diez. Usted debe tener por lo menos 5 detalles que suceden en el cuento. Asegúrese de elegir sólo los detalles más importantes para incluir.
8. Opinión Personal del libro y por qué le gustó o no le gustó.

Asegúrese de que todo su proyecto sea de buena calidad y que muestre cuánto tiempo tomó para trabajar en él. Hacer un proyecto que está orgulloso de y quiere mantener en su habitación o mostrar a otros!

Usted presentará su informe del libro en clase durante la primera semana de la escuela. Practique leer sus cartas para que pueda leer todas las palabras.
